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About the Project

Metropolitan Council Environmental Services (MCES) is making improvements to aging and deteriorating regional sanitary sewer facilities that serve homes and businesses in the city of Chanhassen. The sewer improvement process includes rehabilitation of maintenance holes and installing a liner inside the existing sewer pipe - a process called 'Cured-in-Place Pipe' (CIPP).

What to Expect

- In August, 2017, site preparation and initial excavation will occur. There will be no impact to adjacent roadways or trails.
- After the Labor Day holiday, September 4, 2017:
 - Temporary pumps and pipes will be installed to divert wastewater while the sewer is lined.
 - Sewer and maintenance hole rehabilitation will occur on both sides of Highway 5/Arboretum Blvd.
 - The pedestrian tunnel that goes underneath Arboretum Blvd. will be closed. Pedestrians can cross Highway 5 at Audobon Rd.
 - A section of the bicycle trail to the north of Highway 5 will be closed.
 - A portion of the Paisley Park fence will be temporarily relocated.
- This project is expected to be complete by the end of the 2017 construction season.

How Will the Project Impact Me?

While we do our best to minimize impacts during construction, some temporary inconveniences may occur as this work takes place, including:

- Contractor equipment staging
- Extended work hours, including 24-hour operations during portions of the project
- Lights, dust, noise and vibrations
- Odors related to sewer work and liner resin. We encourage property owners to have water in all drain traps in their property to help contain odors in the pipes.
